RE: REVALIDATION OF THE RESULTS OF THE 2018 CUSTOMER SATISFACTION SURVEY

Dear Sec. Dar and Admin. Seares,


This refers to the revalidated result of strategic measure no. 3 - Percentage of Satisfied Customers – in NTA's 2018 Performance Scorecard.

The Governance Commission has resolved to consider, for 2018, the Customer Satisfaction Survey (CSS) results of GOCCs that have deleted question/s in Part II of the questionnaire, but have otherwise complied with the prescribed standard methodology. It must be emphasized that the instant consideration shall apply only to the 2018 CSS. Subsequent conduct of CSS must strictly comply with the Standard Methodology and Questionnaire.

After review and evaluation of NTA's submissions, the validated score for the Strategic Measure on customer satisfaction is reconsidered as follows:
